Dear Friend:

Since 1975 I have been monitoring social trends in Canada through a series of well-known national surveys. The findings have been widely circulated in Canada and abroad, reported by *CTV* (the "National News", four "Canada AM" interviews), the *CBC* ("The National", "As It Happens", "Man Alive", "Midday", "Cross Canada Check-Up", "Morning-side"), *Maclean's*, and most of Canada's daily newspapers and local television and radio stations. Further, the results have been dealt with extensively in over 20 journal articles, in reports commissioned by the Solicitor General of Canada and the Secretary of State, and, in the recently released book, *The Emerging Generation: An Inside Look at Canada's Teenagers* (Toronto, Irwin Publishing Co.). Findings have also been requested by a large number of government departments and private organizations. In short, the results have been put to good practical and academic use.

PROJECT CAN85 represents an effort to update the views of Canadians. Those contacted are in one of two categories: (1) some of you -- numbering over 1,300 -- were part of the 1975 and 1980 surveys; (2) the remainder of you -- about 2,200 -- have been randomly selected from Canadian adults across the country.

I am asking you to kindly fill out this questionnaire and return it in the enclosed envelope at my expense. I know that your time is valuable (and limited!) and therefore the questionnaire has again been set up so that almost all of the items involve only circling a number.
